Purpose of NNH CommUNITY Schools

Stories & Highlighs from our CS Programs

The purpose of Northside Neighborhood House CommUNITY Schools is to serve as a resource hub that empowers, equips, and engages the community in a way that advocates for equity by promoting the education, well-being, and independence of all students, families, and individuals in the school footprint.

We had a neighbor come in who is a mother to 5 children under 18 and one adult child. She and her children had escaped a domestic violence situation and brought very few belongings with them when they left. One of our CommUNITY School Coordinators offered her a Thrift Store voucher to help her family purchase clothing and other essentials and connected her to our case manager for more resources. While meeting with our case manager, our neighbor shared that she was struggling to sleep at night due to the fear of her abuser. Our case manager was able to refer her to a mental health professional as well as provide her with food that met her family's immediate needs.

Our CommUNITY School program at Soddy Elementary partnered with the school's PTA to host "Conversations at the Dinner Table," a learning opportunity that equipped parents to understand the social-emotional concerns facing their students. During this time, students did hands-on activities with local PBS personality, Andrea "Miss Ladybug" Zoppo, where they explored their abilities to share their feelings. A key practice in our CommUNITY School program is to provide services that remove barriers, form connections, and create opportunities. At Hixson Middle School our program hosted a special night for English as a New Language families to foster connections with each other and embrace the community. Our CommUNITY School Coordinator shared that a family who had recently moved to the United States and spoke little English attended the event. This family received assistance and exchanged heartfelt conversations and contact information with both La Paz and fellow attendees. The event was a beautiful reminder of the importance of overcoming barriers to build community.
